COVID-19 Vaccination






What to bring:



your health card



assistive device (if needed)



mask



aphasia wallet card

At your vaccination appointment:

Clinic staff will be wearing full PPE



They will ask if you have any COVID-19 symptoms before you enter the building.

You will give your name and contact information.



The staff will ask you a number of questions.


If you do not understand, ask them to:

- write it down
- speak slowly



- give you time to understand
- repeat
- say the message in another way

They will ask for your consent or permission to get the vaccine.





They may ask for consent or permission to:

 give your socio-demographic data such as race, household size

This is voluntary.

They will ask you pre-vaccination screening questions.

Please use the aphasia-friendly version if it helps.

They will ask if you have:

- any COVID-19 symptoms
- a history of serious allergic reactions
- received any vaccinations recently

The nurse or staff may ask about your:

- immune system
- allergies
- medical history
- medications






After the shot, you will wait for 15 minutes to make sure that you do not have an allergic reaction.






Staff will give you a paper receipt showing that you recieved the vaccine.






After your vaccination:




